#### A Message & News from the Minister

A travelling, wandering race, we're the people of God Summer holidays give way to Autumn term and the start of a new school year. As a child, I always seemed to begin this term with a uniform "to-grow-into", and new shoes also with growing room.

On the church horizon there are also changes afoot and whilst they may seem challenging, there will be new opportunities to celebrate. Across the URC E, Midlands Synod we have been meeting in response to changed circumstances. At the moment, across the county we have 29 churches being covered by 6.7 ministers. (That is a slightly higher ratio of ministers to churches, than the national allowance for us).

By 2025 we will be reduced to having 4 ministers across the county. Instead of suggesting that more and more churches are offered an ever smaller portion of a minster's time, there is a new pattern being rolled out, where the churches will be clustered and within the group of churches resources will work across the congregations and the minister will be more of a theological resource, empowering networks across the area. This pattern is something ordinands are being trained towards currently. Vacancies in the North West of the county have meant this plan is being set up for some congregations already. Suggestions coming out of the meetings the minister and secretaries (and some other Elders) have been involved with, concern the division of the county into workable units. We particularly favoured the plan which kept the "town" churches of Northampton with their specific areas of mission and concern, in one group, and scooped us into a more rural cluster, resourced from Daventry, and including: Crick, Kilsby, Badby, Weedon & Flore, Paulespury, Long Buckby and Creaton. This would have the benefit of allowing us to relate with other similar churches and focus on the issues which encompass our churches.

Over the coming weeks and months we will be exploring the various suggested groupings; with just sixteen months until I retire, we need to be prayerfully considering what shape will fit us best for the future.

From the Air Ambulance Warwicks and Northants
We at The Air Ambulance Service are a non-government funded charity that flies two local air ambulances, across the counties of Warwickshire, Northamptonshire (WNAA) and Derbyshire, Leicestershire & Rutland (DLRAA)

WNAA was launched in 2003 followed by DLRAA in 2008 expanding our services to fly patients over 5 counties. Our two helicopters provide a rapid response to trauma and medical emergencies over an area of 3850 square miles covering many of the UK's major road networks including the M1, M6, M69 and M42.

With an average response of just 13 minutes, between them, our aircrafts attend on average 6 missions a day between the hours of 7am - 5pm. Our Critical Care Cars then work throughout the night attending medical emergencies that occur within these regions creating a service that operates 24/7, 365 days a year.
